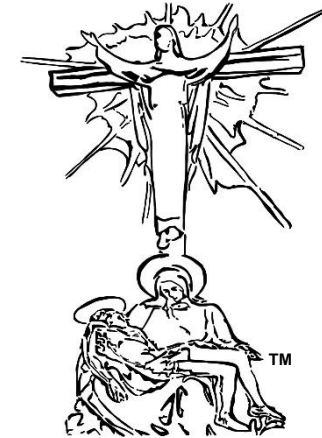

What is the PMO Ministry?

It is a parish ministry formed by fathers and mothers of families who feel the call to intercede before the Blessed Sacrament, for the spiritual and physical salvation of their children and the children of the whole world. Praying is also for the union of families, for the Church, the Pope and for the Priests of the Parish.

Through the prayer of intercession and reparation, God's grace and peace is brought to homes with a change in the hearts of those who participate, trusting in God and in his Blessed Mother to help children evolve as good people and to protect them from all the dangers to which they are exposed in today society.

How did the PMO Ministry Begin?

The Ministry of Praying Fathers and Mothers was born on April 24, 1999, in Mother of Christ Parish in Miami, Florida, under the guardianship of Father Raúl Angulo. The founders of the ministry were a married couple formed by Luis García Cadenas (of pleasant memory) and Loly Verona de García, parishioners of that parish.

It was founded as a parish ministry for fathers and mothers who, through a special calling, are engaged in intercession for the spiritual and physical salvation of their children and the children of the whole world.

To date, the ministry is in about one hundred parishes within the United States, several countries in Latin America and the Caribbean. This, thanks to the dedication of its members and the collaboration of local bishops and priests who find in this ministry, an aid to the heavy burden of evangelization of their parish members.

The fundamental pillars in the struggle for the family are: The Love for the Eucharist, true devotion to the Virgin Mary and obedience to the Pope, his magisterium, to the bishops in communion with the parish priests of each community.

Obedience to the Pope: As baptized, children of God, we recognize the Pope as the legitimate successor of Peter, Vicar of Christ, and our supreme Pastor. For this reason, we submit lovingly to what our Pastor commands us to do. Likewise, we submit to what Bishop orders as a hierarchy of the Church.

Our Slogan

"The Rosary is our weapon" - A true Devotion to the Virgin Mary especially under the invocation of Saint Mary of Guadalupe. They must not lack the Holy Rosary every day, nor the expressions of tenderness and authentic devotion to our Mother.

"The Eucharist is our lifeblood" - Each member, as far as possible, will not only participate in the Eucharist daily, but will also try to visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament every day. Likewise, he will work with all his strength so that Jesus present in the Eucharist may be better known and loved by all. That is why our cry is: *"Hallelujah! Glory to God."*

Personal plan for spiritual growth.

- Fasting on bread and water or with another type of fasting, once a week.
- Daily Mass and Eucharist.
- Visit and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
- Monthly confession.
- Continuous prayer, especially the daily rosary
- Pray the Rosary of Mercy every day at 3 pm.
- Offering our daily lives, in good and bad times.

- We also promote conferences of priests or trained persons to deepen spirituality and help lead a holy life and family.
- We are working on the plan of the new evangelization

throughout America according to the indications given to us by the Holy Church, taking the Virgin of Guadalupe, "Empress of America" as patroness.

- Homage to Mary Mother. It is celebrated every January 1st with a rosary and songs, to the Blessed Virgin Mary, under the invocation of the **Mother of God**. She is an example to be imitated by all mothers, and her home in Nazareth is the example that is to be achieved in all homes in the world.
