#### Six Helpful Homiletic Gadgets

- 1. The Rhetorical Question: "Did You Notice...?" and "Do You Recall...?"
- 2. Compose the Scene with Inferences: Sights, Smells, Tastes, Touches, and Sounds
- 3. Supply the Missing Context: "While We Were Away on Commercial Break..."
- 4. Find the Overlap: How Would This Dynamic Look in Today's America?
- 5. "Jesus Offers a Choice: Today We Can Make a Different Choice."
- 6. The Eucharist (and Other Sacraments) Are Always Relevant: Say How.

#### Questions to Ponder with Various Kinds of Texts

#### With Miracle Stories (M)

- 1. What do we know about the miracle's beneficiary?
- 2. How does the miracle aid the beneficiary to perceive God's grace?
- 3. How do bystanders respond to the miracle? (After all, we are bystanders too.)

#### With Parables (P)

- 1. To whom is Jesus addressing this parable? What are they doing wrong (usually)?
- 2. What kind of problematic behavior does the parable seek to expose? How?
- 3. What does the Evangelist likely want his reader to learn from the parable?

#### With Controversies (C)

- 1. With whom is Jesus in conflict? What do we know about them? What explains their hostility to the Lord?
- 2. Do we tend to approach the Lord with similar hostility? How so?
- 3. What is at stake in the conflict? Is the Lord insistent? If so, why?

#### With Discourses (D)

- 1. Where does the discourse begin and end? With what interruptions?
- 2. What is the purpose of the entire discourse? How does this section of it serve that purpose?
- 3. To what extent could this discourse be addressed to a modern audience? Under what conditions? What experiences would the modern audience need to share in order to grasp the Lord's words?

#### With Other Narratives (N)

- 1. Who are the characters developed in the story? Why does the Evangelist emphasize them?
- 2. Who is silent in the episode? How might they passively participate in the event?
- 3. Does the Evangelist interrupt his storytelling with an editorial? If so, with what effect?

#### A Few General Considerations Always Relevant

- 1. What details does the Evangelist supply? Writing materials were expensive then; why did he invest valuable space to include them?
- 2. What importance does the setting play in the story? Does geography affect the story's meaning at all?
- 3. Does the story quote or allude to the Old Testament? If so, why? (And check the Lectionary: there's a decent chance that allusion is the first reading in a Sunday of Ordinary Time.)
- 4. How does the text touch you emotionally? Might the Evangelist be trying to elicit ire, befuddlement, laughter, sympathy, or introspection? That's part of the story!
