

In 2023..

- 195,354 individuals were fed through groceries acquired in a food pantry or hot meals from a soup kitchen.

- 17,016 seniors had their needs assessed by a caseworker and were offered assistance with interpretation services, transportation, food, and community referrals in order to remain in their homes and live independently.


- 14,007 adults & children benefited from educational services which help to empower and build a brighter future.

- 5,020 victims of human trafficking received comprehensive case management and housing services.
 - 3,840 adults & children obtained permanent or temporary housing.

Catholic Charities, Inc. of the Diocese of Venice provides a wide range of services, including emergency assistance, food and housing, counseling and mental health services, as

well as programs for seniors and children.

Within a span of a year, Casa Maria Soup Kitchen's dedicated volunteers serve an average of 35,000 hot lunches each year to the impoverished and hungry.



Guadalupe Social Services provides "The Clothing Room" which is open to anyone in the Immokalee community to choose items

that have been donated. At the same site, "The Shower Program" serves the chronically homeless or individuals living in substandard housing. Those in need receive a change of clothes, hygiene products, a towel and, of

example is the "Weekend Power Pack Food Program" which provides homeless elementary students with food to sustain them through the weekend when school meals are not available.

Catholic Charities strives to create a safe and nurturing environment where individuals can regain stability and work towards a better to-

morrow by providing affordable and transitional housing solutions. In addition to shelter, a wide array of support services are offered, including case management, financial assistance, and life skills development.

The **Office of Marriage and Family Life** helps prepare men and women for their lifelong marriage vows through retreats, conferences, and Natural Family Planning classes. In an effort to continuously promote marriage, enrichment seminars are also offered for those already married.

Witness to Love is the marriage prep program being used for the formation of young engaged couples. This program integrates modern principles of psychology and builds upon virtues to help couples explore more deeply into their relationship with each other and the Lord.

This process is used as an evangelization tool in a way that truly renews trust among young Catholic couples, families, and the parish that becomes their

new home. "Witness to Love" provides this process through leadership formation as well as through sacramental preparation and enrichment, ultimately, leading to parish renewal.


The annual **Together in Holiness Confer**ence provides an opportunity for married and engaged couples to spend quality time together. Inspiring

presentations by well known speakers, Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, and Reconciliation are a part of the day.

The Annual Anniversary Mass, attended by over 600 couples yearly, celebrates 25 and more years of marriage. This special remembrance Mass honors those in attendance and serves as a testimony of the Sacrament of Marriage.

Through the **Bereavement Ministry**, suffering from the loss of life in a family is addressed. This group setting facilitates the expression of emotions through natural stages of grief.







The **Office of Vocations** has the primary responsibility to foster and support individuals who feel called to serve the Church as priests or members of religious communities. This is accomplished through discernment retreats, prayer, reflection, and fellowship with others on a similar journey. The Office actively collaborates with the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry, Catholic schools, and parishes in a joint effort to provide a nurturing environment for young people discerning a religious vocation.

The formation process of seminarians involves several years of academic study, spiritual development, hu-



man formation, and pastoral training. These studies aim to provide a solid foundation in Catholic Theology and prepare them for the responsibilities of priesthood.

Seminarians experience life as a priest by assisting a pastor in a parish, bringing communion to shut ins, visiting the elderly, and serving the youth of the Dioceses during the summer months.

Religious sisters working within the Diocese of Venice have dedicated their lives to serving God and others through prayer, ministry, and various works of charity. They often serve as teachers, administrators, and directors of Religious Education. The sisters bring their spiritual commitment, virtues,

and training to Catholic education, nurturing the intellectual, moral, and spiritual formation of youth. Often, they are assigned to locations where they can serve the most in need.

The Permanent Diaconate Program serves to facilitate the formation of men called to the roll of Permanent Deacon. Once ordained,







these men receive pastoral care and ongoing formation.

The Catholic Church has a long tradition of evangelization, and it is seen as a response to the great commission of Jesus to "...go and make disciples of all nations..." Not just about converting people to the Catholic faith, evangelization also involves publicly living out the faith so as to be a witness to others. At the Diocese of Venice, this is done through the **Office of Evangelization**.

Conferences, Bible study, Theology on Tap, and Eucharistic Congresses are just a few ways the Diocese brings hope, healing, and the opportunity for salvation to



those in need in Southwest Florida. Bringing the Joy and Truth of the Gospel

bringing the Joy and Truth of the Gosper to the new generation is the primary mission of the Office of Youth and Young Adult Outreach. It helps coordinate large scale Diocesan events and pilgrimages to help create opportunities for youth and young adults to grow closer to the Lord. This office offers guidance and support to parishes and schools to empower those ministering to young faithful.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Campo San José Retreat Centers offer a variety of spiritual growth experiences for individuals and groups seeking to

deepen their faith, refocus on their spiritual lives, develop a relationship with Christ or encounter God in a peaceful and supportive environ-



ment.

Although heavily damaged by Hurricane Ian, Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Retreat Center is now open for individual, group, and parish retreats.

The Campo San José Retreat Center primarily hosts groups with the focus directed to spiritual enrichment and growth.

With assistance from the Diocesan Department of Com-

munications, a televised Mass is made available weekly for the homebound, hospitalized, and all those unable to attend Mass at a local parish.

The **Office of Religious Education** oversees the faith formation of children and administering adult faith formation programs such as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. Sacramental preparation ensures that individuals gain a solid understanding of the Church's teaching and liturgy, allowing them to fully participate in the mission and life of the Church.

On-going formation and support for cathechetical leaders are offered through retreats, conferences, and workshops.

The **Catholic Schools Department** serves more than 6,200 students, a record breaking number, at 15 Catholic schools.

the remaining 3% of students entering the military or work force. In addition, students receive college scholarship awards that are three times the amount of that of public school counterparts.





Administrative services play a crucial role in fulfilling the mission of serving those in need and sharing the Gospel's joy. The Diocese of Venice relies on the collective efforts of clergy, dedicated staff members, and volunteers to achieve this mission.

At the Catholic Center, professionals in various fields provide direction and administrative services to parishes and schools. The following is a list of the offices and departments and how each one contributes to the work being accomplished at parishes, Schools, and the Church in Southwest Florida.

- The **Office of Human Resources** coordinates services including recruitment, employee relations, human resource policies, legal compliance, as well as benefit and pension administration.

- The **Internal Financial Services Department** provides support for parish bookkeepers and business managers to ensure compliance with Diocesan policies and procedures. The Department also oversees and coordinates financial reviews



carried out by independent CPA firms every three years for all parishes, schools and missions.

- The Worship Office provides guidance for the development of liturgical celebrations, prayer, and music.

- The **Building Department** provides support in the areas of construction, renovations, facility management, and loss prevention. Following a natural disaster, this Department coordinates restoration activities for all Diocesan buildings.

- The Safe Environment Program educates all children and adults in initiatives and protocols designed to create a safe and secure environment.

- The **Finance Department** oversees support programs including employee benefits, self-insurance, and the Diocese of Venice Savings & Loan Trust Fund. The Department is also responsible for the financial administration of the Catholic Center's annual budget, which includes providing regular financial reporting to the Bishop and Diocesan Finance Council.

- The Diocesan **Marriage Tribunal** handles issues relating to marriage, such as dispensations that may be required for those preparing to get married, as well as annulments.

- Providing advice and recommendations based on the optimal technological configurations for projects is a primary responsibility of the **Office of Information Technology**.

- So as to reduce the exposure of liability, the Risk and Insurance Office provides

educational workshops and implementation of policies and procedures to all Diocesan entities.


